Dear Parishioners

Next Sunday, November 5, 2017 is the beginning of National Vocation Awareness Week. The theme of our liturgy, readings and homily next week will reflect upon vocations. What is a vocation? Well, the truth is that God has a plan for each one of his children. That plan is that he wants his children to be truly happy. That happiness is found when one discovers what God is calling them to. When one discovers their true vocation in life, they are doing what God wants and that makes one the happiest in life. Imagine asking your son what he wants to be when he grows up, and he answers, "I want to be a priest!" What would your reaction be? Would you be worried or elated or somewhere in between?

Parents, if you are truly concerned about the well-being and happiness of your children, it would make sense then to help them discern their true vocations in life: marriage, priesthood, or religious life. How can you help your son or daughter discover what God wants of them in life? Here are some suggestions: Snuggle up with the children and read stories of the saints who were priests and religious, or about the life of Pope John Paul II as he was growing up. Watch movies about the saints that depict heroic priests and religious. Occasionally we show those types of movies at the Port Austin Community Players.

If a movie or a TV show sends the wrong message about sexuality or marriage. Defend the sacrament of marriage by setting the record straight. Explain to them what authentic love and happiness really is.

Pray together with the children or as a family. Pray often for priests and religious. Let the children hear the adults pray for their own children's futures.

Don't be afraid to speak openly about marriage, priesthood, and religious life. Befriend a priest or religious. This is not difficult to do. Invite a priest or religious to dinner and ask for a blessing of the home or family. When young people are comfortable around priests and religious, they will be much more comfortable thinking about the idea of a priestly and religious vocation when they grow older. More next week.
