" Jesus said to her, 'Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" **JOHN 11:40**

Many of us say that we believe in God. We go to church on Sunday. We volunteer for events at our parish. But when life gets hard, the pressure is on, things aren't going our way, do we really believe, do we really put our trust in the Lord? When we live a life of gratitude, being thankful for the gifts we have been given, we really do see that God is providing all that we need.

Dear Parishioners,

Each time we pray the Stations of the Cross, we gain a Plenary indulgence. A Plenary indulgence, granted by the Church gives us full remission of temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven. We can accept the indulgence for ourselves or we may apply it to a deceased loved one who, if in Purgatory, may have their time shortened.

This is what the Catechism of the Catholic Church says in paragraphs 1472-1473: "To understand this doctrine and practice of the Church, it is necessary to understand that sin has a double consequence. Grave sin deprives us of communion with God and therefore makes us incapable of eternal life, the privation of which is called "eternal punishment" of sin. On the other hand every sin, even venial, entails an unhealthy attachment to creatures, which must be purified either here on earth, or after death in the state called Purgatory. This purification frees one from what is called "temporal punishment" of sin. These two punishments must not be conceived as some kind of vengeance inflicted by God from without, but as following from the very nature of sin. A conversion which proceeds from a fervent charity can attain the complete purification of the sinner in such a way that no punishment would remain.

The forgiveness of sin and the restoration of communion with God entail the remission of the eternal punishment of sin, but temporal punishment of sin remains. While patiently bearing sufferings and trials of all kinds and, when the day comes, serenely facing death, the Christian must strive to accept this temporal punishment of sin as a grace. He should strive by works of mercy and charity, as well as prayer and the various practices of penance, to put off the "old man" and put on the "new man."

The Stations of the Cross is just one way by which we can reduce the temporal punishment of sin that still remains in us after we have confessed our sins through the Sacrament of Penance. It would be wonderful to see more parishioners young and old participating and taking advantage of this devotion offered in our parish. Devout participation may benefit our deceased loved ones as well. Please pray for the following seminarians to be ordained to the Order of Deacon, with the intention of becoming ordained priests next year: Stephen Blaxton whose home parish is St. Vincent DePaul, Shepherd, Michigan and Adam Maher whose home parish is Ave Maria, Port Sanilac, Michigan. The ordination of these two candidates will take place at St. Mary Cathedral on Friday, May 19, 2017 at 2:30 P.M. Please actively promote vocations to the priesthood in our parish through prayer and by speaking to your children and grandchildren about this beautiful vocation. Finally, we wish to recognize those children from our parish who were confirmed by Bishop Cistone on Saturday in Caseville: Griffin Schipinski, Erica Forbing, Chase Murawski, Luke Szymanski, Madalyn Glaza, Michael Bruce, Mary Bruce, Jake Golochowicz, and Jonathan Goretski.
