Dear Parishioners,

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. All believers, Catholic and Non-Catholic are welcome and strongly encouraged to participate in the Divine Mercy Devotions of our Parish from 1:00 - 3:00pm on Divine Mercy Sunday. These devotions include: Confession, Divine Mercy Chaplet, and Veneration of the Image of Divine Mercy, Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, ending with Divine Mercy Sunday Mass which fulfills one's Sunday obligation.

The origin of the Divine Mercy Devotion comes to us through Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska of the Most Blessed Sacrament who was canonized as the very first saint of the Third Millennium by Pope John Paul II in Rome on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 30, 2000.

Saint Faustina was called to sanctity at a very early age and entered religious life with the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Poland in 1925. On Sunday, February 22, 1931, Jesus appeared to her with bright rays of light emanating from His heart. He said to her, "Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: 'Jesus, I trust in You!' I desire that this image be venerated...in your chapel, and throughout the world.

We have a replica of the image painted by Saint Faustina available for veneration in our parish churches as our Lord requested. At the entrance of Church, Holy cards with the image are available as well. Families are encouraged to have the image of Divine Mercy displayed in a prominent place in their homes.

To receive full pardon of temporary punishment due to sin on this Feast of Divine Mercy, which is the full remission of all punishment due to sins already confessed, one must make a good confession within either 15 days before or 15 days after the Feast and remain in God's grace during this time, one must receive Holy Communion, pray an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Apostles Creed for the intentions of Pope Francis and venerate the image of Divine Mercy in church or at home.

For those praying the Novena, our Lord requests, if possible, to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3:00PM, the hour of His death, the hour of mercy. All believers are encouraged to pray the chaplet daily throughout the year.
