Dear Parishioners,

Let me recommend to you the daily wearing of the Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel for all serious Catholics. Basically, the Brown Scapular is a part of the habit of the Order of Mt. Carmel. In miniature form, it consists of two small pieces of brown material connected by a string or chain and worn over the shoulders. The Carmelite Order originated on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land near the cave of Elijah the Prophet, who was the inspiration of the early members of Carmel.

Our Lady appeared at Mt. Carmel to St. Simon Stock on July 16, 1251 and made the following promise: "This shall be to you and all Carmelites, a privilege that anyone who dies clothed in this shall not suffer eternal fire; and if wearing it they die, they shall be saved." The wearing of the Scapular must be understood to mean that one is striving earnestly to live up to all Christian ideals. It does not take the place of the Church's Sacraments, but is an outward sign of inward commitment to virtue and Christian piety, under the patronage of Mary.

Saints and pontiffs have often warned of the folly of abusing Mary's promise. Pope Pius XI said, "Those who wish to have Mary as a helper at the hour of death must in life merit such a signal favor by abstaining from sin and laboring in her honor." What are the privileges related to the Brown Scapular? Our Lady promised to release from purgatory soon after death all those who (1) wear the Brown Scapular, and (2) observe chastity according to their state in life.

To receive the full benefit of the Brown Scapular one must be invested in it first. A priest or a deacon can invest one in the Confraternity of the Brown Scapular. The scapular is blessed by a priest or deacon. After proper investiture in the Scapular, a person need not have subsequent Scapulars blessed. Once invested, you are invested until death. If one fails to wear the Scapular for a time, one needs only to begin wearing it again. It has long been custom to enroll children in the Brown Scapular of Carmel at First Communion time. It is unfortunate that this custom has been neglected in recent years, when all Christians need this spiritual help the most. In our parish, I have recently renewed this venerable custom of enrolling our First Communion Candidates in the Confraternity of the Brown Scapular.

Even non-Catholics are warmly encouraged to wear the Brown Scapular and in this special way honor Jesus' Mother. Mary's Motherhood is not limited to Catholics; it is extended to all humanity. Many miracles of conversion have been wrought in favor of good non-Catholics who practiced the scapular devotion.

At Fatima in 1917, the Mother of God, once again emphasized the vital importance of the *daily* recitation of the Rosary and signaled Her desire that all Catholics wear the Brown Scapular as a visible sign of their devotion.
