

Let us keep in our prayers, the soul and family of Jeff Gottschalk Dear Parishioners,

Archbishop William E. Lori wrote in the December issue of Columbia Magazine about the reality of over-crowded Christmas Masses and how we should act or react to such a reality. Our natural reaction might be that we are amazed at the crowd, maybe even angry that our parking place and our regular pews have been taken. Whatever the case, we are called to reach out and welcome Catholics who seldom or no longer practice their faith.

What is our responsibility toward these Catholics that we so rarely see in church? Well, most are Catholic, some are out of town visitors, and some are Christmas and Easter Catholics. Maybe some of you have lamented about a teenage or adult child who no longer practices the Faith. As parents, "We tried to do everything right. Where did we go wrong?" It is a source of sorrow for a faithful Catholic when a spouse stops practicing the faith. Often families never discuss the situation, figuring it will do more harm than good.

There are many reasons why Catholics stop practicing the faith even if they check in once a year. They may be angry at the Church for one reason or another. They may disagree with Church teaching or they feel mistreated by someone representing the Church. Others did not feel welcome in their parish church or failed to find help in time of need.

Some never really encountered the Lord or knew their faith. Eventually, they no longer saw the point in coming to Mass each week. Often it is sports or other activities that simply crowd out the practice of the faith. Or others have the view that they can be spiritual but not religious. And then there is the all-too-common tendency of fallen human nature to drift from God.

Bishop Lori, suggests several ways of responding to so many people at our Christmas Masses: First, we should examine our own consciences, not theirs. I might ask myself, what have I done or not done to alienate them from Church. Have I given people reason not to practice their faith? Second, we should pray for those who are paying their annual semi-annual visit to the parish. Pray that they will be moved to open themselves to the Lord and find their way back to Church. We should pray for ourselves that we might become instruments in helping others find their way back to the fold. Third, we should take some measure of responsibility for our normally absent brothers and sisters. St. John Paul II taught that while the Pope and Bishops have the responsibility to lead, the laity are the primary agents in spreading the Gospel in our times. This involves bearing witness to the joy of the Gospel and a readiness to listen. A church that does not listen to why people have left will not be in a good position to give reasons why they should return.

Bishop Lori concludes, "As you arrive at Mass this Christmas, let us present the newborn Savior a gift: our resolve, for the coming year, to help bring others back to the practice of the faith."
