Dear Parishioners,

Saint John Paul II designated February 11<sup>th</sup> as World Day of Prayer for the Sick, “a special time of prayer and sharing, of offering one’s suffering for the good of the Church and of reminding us to see in our sick brothers and sisters the face of Christ who, by suffering, dying, and rising, achieved the salvation of humankind.”

Those parishioners in hospitals, nursing homes, and shut-ins have priority and have already received visits from the pastor. However, many parishioners who attend Mass regularly have also been ill, in weakened health or advanced in age. **For this reason, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick during the weekend Masses on February 8-9.**



This sacrament may be received if someone is seriously ill, in weakened health, or advanced in years. Many receive this sacrament before surgery or before taking chemo or radiation therapies. Certainly, if someone is in danger of death, please call the priest. There is no limit to the number of times one may receive the sacrament.

The effect of the sacrament is to unite us to the redemptive suffering of Christ for the salvation of the world. The sacrament also leads to the forgiveness of a person’s sins if the person is unable to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Another effect of the sacrament is to strengthen us and give us peace to endure the inevitable suffering that comes with sickness and old age. The sacrament helps a person regain mental and physical health, if this is God’s will for us and will lead to the health of the soul.

Anointing of the Sick at Mass requires no special seating or name tags. After the homily, I will simply ask those to be anointed to please stand as we call down the spirit upon those to be anointed. For the anointing itself, you will be invited to come forward in the same way as you would for Holy Communion. I will lay my hand upon your head and anoint your forehead with the oil of the sick. Have the top of both hands ready to be anointed as well. After this you may return to your seat, as I pray the concluding prayer. For those few who cannot come forward, I will go to your pew for the anointing. Please let me or the usher know before Mass.

Sunday, February 9<sup>th</sup> is also World Marriage Day. At the end of Mass, I will ask all married couples in church to stand for a special blessing. Congratulations and thank you to all those married couples who by their faithfulness have given witness to the love of Christ in our communities.

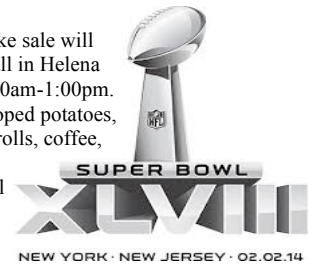
