and I desire to receive You into my soul.


Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally,

### Dear Parishioners,

During this Church year dedicated to St. Joseph, I would like to organize a group to make 33-days toward consecration to St. Joseph. I would particularly emphasize that men of the parish respond to this invitation. This, however, is



open to anyone who would like to do it. In order to participate in this, please, pick up your packet at the back of church. There are 30 packets at St. Michael's and 15 packets at St. Mary's. Do not worry if you do not get a copy this week. There will be more available next week.

Our group meetings will take place for six Sundays after 8:30 AM Mass at St. Mary's and after 10:30 AM Mass in St. Michael's: Feb. 14, 21, 28, and March 7, 14, and 21. In order to make the consecration on or around the Solemnity of St. Joseph, March 19, 2021, our first meeting would be held on Sunday, February 14, 2021 after Mass. I expect the meetings to be no more than ½ hour.

With the backdrop of a worldwide pandemic, crisis in the Church, political and economic uncertainty, something extraordinary is underway and it has to do with St. Joseph. At a time when families are under attack, marriages are falling apart, when people have turned away from God, when there is so much anxiety and fear, we really need to turn to St. Joseph. We need his protection. His intercession is the most powerful after the Blessed Virgin Mary. But when we honor Joseph we also honor Mary, his spouse.

Since 1870, when Pope Pius IX declared St. Joseph the Patron of the Universal Church—telling the world to turn to St. Joseph as our loving father, loving spiritual father—there has been so much momentum and now it is reaching a crescendo.

In 1879, St. Joseph appeared in Knock Ireland. In 1889, Pope Leo XIII issued the Church's first encyclical on St. Joseph. In 1909, Pope Pius X approved the Litany of St. Joseph. In 1917, following the miracle of the sun, St. Joseph appear at Fatima holding the Christ Child. In 1962, Pope John XXIII added St. Joseph's name to the Eucharistic prayer I, known as the Roman Canon. In 2013, Pope Francis added St. Joseph to Eucharistic prayers II, III, and IV. This year 2021, on the occasion of the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of St. Joseph being declared Patron of the Universal Church, Pope Francis has been named this the Year of St. Joseph. More has been done to promote devotion to St. Joseph within the last 150 years than in the first 1800 years of the Church. The Holy Spirit is evidently at work in all of this.

Won't you join us then, in our group consecration to St. Joseph with daily preparation beginning on February 14<sup>th</sup> leading us toward consecration day on March 19<sup>th</sup>. If, for some reason you cannot make the first group, there will be other days related to St. Joseph during the year when we can repeat the journey once again.
