

Dear Parishioners,

January 22nd is the 44th Anniversary of the U. S. Supreme Court ruling on Roe vs. Wade. In its 1973 decision, the Court ruled that the Constitution requires states to permit abortion for any reason. The American people, the Court decided, are not allowed to legally protect human beings in utero from acts of violence that kill them (as long as the mother gives her permission).

Since 1973, there have been 56,662,169 legal abortions in the United States of America. This is equal to the population of 18 States in the center of the nation. It is a fact that legal abortion has targeted mostly poor minorities, Blacks and Hispanics more than any other groups. The extermination from the country of these poor minorities was the intended purpose of Margaret Sanger back in 1916 when she established Planned Parenthood, America's largest abortion provider. She thought of these races as inferior and called them, "human weeds."

President Ronald Reagan had stated: "The decision by the seven man majority in Roe vs. Wade has so far been made to stick. But the Court's decision has by no means settled the debate. Instead, Roe vs. Wade has become a continuing prod to the conscience of the nation."

Norma McCorvey, better known as "Jane Roe" was the plaintiff in the landmark American lawsuit of Roe vs. Wade in 1973. She had requested that public funds pay for her abortion. In the end, she never had the abortion. She later converted to Christianity and now struggles for the Pro-life cause.

Evangelist, Alveda King, a member of Priest's for Life, claimed that her Uncle, Dr. Martin Luther King would have supported the Pro-Life cause saying, "This is the civil rights movement."

Since the Liturgy of the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time takes precedence over National Day of Prayer for Life—this observance has been transferred to Monday, January 23, 2017.

May each of us support the pro-life cause, through advocacy, prayer, and education.
