Dear Parishioners,

Today, we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, a prolongation of the Feast of Christmas. Epiphany means “manifestation” or “to come forth.” In the Church, it means the revealing of Christ to the world, not just to the Jewish people. The first Gentiles—non-Jews—to acknowledge Jesus as the “King of the Jews” were the Wise Men—or Magi in the original Greek of the New Testament.

The Magi were probably oriental priests or astrologers who looked for signs in the stars. They were the equivalent of those who today write horoscopes, although they were probably taken much more seriously in their own land and culture. While observing the heavens, they discovered an unusual conjunction of the planets, Mars, Jupiter, and Saturn in the year 7 A.D. which produced a brilliant light in the skies. This astrological event was so extraordinary that the astrologers or religious leaders in the area of Persia, that is present day Iran, began their journey toward the west.

Somehow the Magi deduced that the star announced the birth of a child to be the King of the Jews, one who was to be the royal heir of the promises to David. The star did not lead them to Jerusalem, but they went there because they thought the new-born king would be found there. They were wrong, but it made sense to go there since it was the royal city of the Jews. The Magi thought the most logical place to get more information was from King Herod. This news of a new-born to King Herod and all of Jerusalem was one of alarm and dismay. Herod was an extremely jealous person. He did not desire that anyone should come and challenge or change the status quo. In fact, King Herod had murdered hundreds of persons, even from his own family, considering them obstacles to his reign.

The prophecy of Micah had announced the greatness of the humble, little town of Bethlehem. The word Bethlehem means “house of bread.” While God continues to show his providential wisdom through the door of the small and humble. We continue to look for salvation from the powerful of the world.

The Magi saw the child and his Mother, with a vision that enlightened their hearts. Because of that vision they adored the Child and offered him the best they had to offer: Gold for Jesus, King, and Incense for Jesus, Priest, and Myrrh for Jesus, Victim. You and I were there at the manger with the Magi; they were our representatives. Now we are called to follow in their footsteps to offer Christ the best of ourselves, of our time, of our talent, and of our possessions.

The Gospel tells us that after their encounter with Jesus they returned to their land by a different route because they returned transformed by their faith. When we encounter the new-born Jesus, our lives can never be the same again. We are transformed and our ways are changed. This being so, by what path will we follow Christ by our lives?

The legend of the “Magi” was later converted to “Kings” (Today we celebrate the day of the King of Kings). In them is the fulfillment of the prophecies of the psalms. The legend also gives the Kings their names, Melchor, Gaspar, and Balthazar and they are of different races: white, black, and red or yellow. The legend says that they were converted to Christianity and that they suffered martyrdom and are buried in the Cathedral of Cologne, Germany.
