Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Are you of another faith tradition and would you like to become Catholic? Are you an adult who was never baptized, or never made First Holy Communion, or was never confirmed, but would now like to do so? Then Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is for you. RCIA is for adults, youth, or children. Please call Fr. Craig or sign up at the parish office. Fr. Craig will be the leader and instructor. Schedule is yet to be determined.

The RCIA is more than simply initiating new members into the Sacraments. It is a total initiation into the community of faith. RCIA is not a program. It is what we are all about as Christians. As new believers are added to the community, we as members of the community are called to remember our own initiation into the faith and to recommit ourselves to what it means to be Catholic.

The whole parish will be involved in the Rites at various stages of initiation. The RCIA consists of four stages: **1) Inquiry Period.** This is basically a presentation of our beliefs and to answer any questions the inquirers may have so that can make an informed decision about whether or not to continue. **2) Catechumenate Period.** This period begins with the Rite of Acceptance on the First Sunday of Advent. This is when the inquirers become catechumens. The catechumen makes a commitment to study more deeply the truths of our Catholic Faith. **3) Period of Enlightenment.** This period begins with the Rite of Election on the First Sunday of Lent. The catechumen makes a commitment to prepare for the reception of Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. Those who are of other faith traditions or those who have already been validly baptized as Catholics may be called to make a Profession of Faith at the Easter Vigil as a sign of recommitment before receiving Confirmation and Holy Communion. Once the sacraments are received, the process of initiation is not yet fully complete. **4) Mystagogia.** This is the period from Easter to Pentecost. The newly initiated are called to reflect on the meaning of the initiation or sacraments they have received and to focus on how they might become involved as active believers in the life of the parish.

RCIA is liturgically based. Meaning that the catechumens will also reflect on the Liturgy of the Word of each Sunday of the year. Periodically, I will invite leaders from different areas of parish life to speak to our catechumens so that they might get some ideas about how they could serve others in the future.

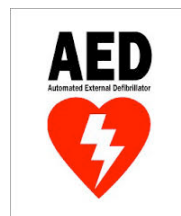
