

1 PETER 2:7

(199/430) \$ 4,507.00 \$ 484.00 \$ 20.00 The Scriptures today are filled with architecture, house, building—related images. Like these structures that we use and inhabit regularly, we sometimes take for granted the beauty and usefulness of our spiritual

In today's first reading, we are told about the Greek Jewish Christians who were not receiving equal service as compared to the Hebrew Jewish Christians. This inequitable treatment was often brought about because the new faith was growing rapidly and spreading to other cultures outside of Israel. Hence, there was need for a new ministry to deal with the diverse needs of the community. The twelve apostles proposed that seven men be selected to serve as deacons (from the Greek word for "service"). The role of the deacon was to "wait on tables," meeting the physical needs of the community, while the twelve engage in the ministry of the word.

As with the Sacrament of Confirmation, Anointing of the Sick, Ordination to the Priesthood, and to the Episcopacy, today's reading speaks of the "laving on of hands" by the apostles, ordaining the seven deacons. The "laving on of hands" signifies the decent of the Holy Spirit upon them. to strengthen them in their service. The "laying on of hands," recently took place, when Bishop Cistone laid hands upon the head of each of our children who received the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation.

The Second Reading from Peter gets into the theme of building materials. I am sure we have all experienced the beauty of different churches. In some churches we might feel the presence of God in a special way because of the beauty of the building. Peter is suggesting that each of us are living stones which construct the spiritual temple, the house of God. We are spiritual stones chosen and precious in God's sight when we stay connected to Jesus. In the Holy Eucharist, we are called to be a priestly people who offer the sacrifice of our lives together with Jesus sacrifice on the cross. We may have to suffer rejection by those who have no faith, but like Jesus who was the stone rejected by the builders, he has now become the cornerstone. The cornerstone is the most important and precious stone of the building. Likewise, Peter says: "You are 'a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own, so that you may announce the praises' of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light."

In the Gospel Jesus tells his disciples that he has prepared a special place for them in the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus is announcing his imminent departure. Although Jesus is preparing for his death and resurrection in the reading, the liturgy seems to be preparing us for the time of his Ascension into heaven. Jesus promises us that he will return again at the hour of our death and at the Second Coming to take us to himself into that heavenly dwelling place. Like doubting Thomas, we might doubt from time to time. But Jesus responds that he has already shown us the way to the Father. Jesus says he is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. The Holy Spirit, the Paraclete has been given to us as helper and guide to all that Jesus has taught us. We follow Jesus the way, the truth and the life when we receive Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in Holy Communion. If we do this, we shall arrive safely to that beautiful dwelling place Jesus has prepared for those who love him.
