

May 13, 2017 is the 100th anniversary of the apparitions of our Lady of Fatima to three children in Fatima, Portugal. Our Lady first appeared at Fatima on May 13, 1917. She continued to appear to the children on the 13th of every consecutive month until October when at least 70,000 people witnessed the miracle of the sun. The sun danced in the sky after a rain storm. At the end of the display, it appeared as if the end of the world was imminent as the sun fell towards the earth. But the sun suddenly returned to its normal place in the sky and everyone's clothing became dry. There were also miracles of healing for those suffering handicaps. At Fatima, Our Lady requested the daily rosary and penance for the conversion of sinners. Our Lady also requested that the Holy Father consecrate Russia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary in union with all the Bishops of the world. If her requests were heeded Russia would be converted and there would be a period of peace in the world. However, if her requests were not heeded, another worse war would break out (World War II). Our Lady predicted that Russia would perpetrate her errors throughout the world. Many nations would be annihilated, the good would be martyred, and the Holy Father would have much to suffer. Our Lady of Fatima predicted that Francisco and Lucia would die soon and go to heaven. The oldest of the children, Lucia, lived as a Religious Sister until the age of 97. Sr. Lucia died on February 13, 2005. Our Lord desired that Sister Lucia should remain on earth for a longer time to spread our Lady's message.

In private correspondence that Sr. Lucia gave permission to be published, Sr. Lucia says that Pope John Paul II's consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary for the salvation of humanity on March 25, 1984, had sufficed to fulfill our Lady's request. Sr. Lucia had declared that the 1984 consecration had prevented a nuclear war that otherwise would have taken place in 1985. Soon after, we witnessed the sudden evaporation of Soviet Communism at the end of the 20th Century. Pope Benedict XVI said that Our Lady of Fatima's requests continue to be as relevant today as they were back in 1917.

At both, St. Michael's and at St. Mary's, we have two different banners displayed to commemorate the 100th anniversary of our Lady of Fatima's apparitions. Also to commemorate this occasion, on Mother's Day, we will bless our Lady Fatima's statue that came from St. Edward's Hall and will now find a new home at St. Mary's. On Mother's Day we will have a May crowning at both churches. Also to commemorate the anniversary, on Sunday, May 21, 2017 at the Port Austin Community Players we will have a showing of the classic 1950's movie, *The Story of Our Lady of Fatima*. The movie is for general audiences, suitable for our families and children. It is free of charge and all are welcome.
