Pray for the Sick

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

All parishioners are invited to a Public Square Rosary to be prayed at St. Mary's Church, Kinde next Tuesday, October 13, starting at 6:00 PM, followed by Mass. The purpose of this special rosary is that as human efforts have failed to solve America's key problems, we turn to God through his holy Mother, asking his urgent help.

Following are some more reasons why we should pray the rosary:

- 1) Tuesday, marks the 98th Anniversary of the Miracle of the Sun, witnessed by 70,000 people at Fatima, including atheists, and anti-Catholics. Some of them converted. The 2015 Public Square Rosary Rallies will remind the person on the street that conversion is possible.
- 2) We pray the rosary in order to reach fallen away Catholics: According to research, only 28% of Catholics attend Mass in America. We pray that 72% or 46 million of non-practicing Catholics will be moved to become better Catholics.
- 3) The rosary has had powerful results at abortion clinics. Pro-life Catholics have prayed the rosary in front of abortion clinics for decades. The power of this prayer has blunted the advance of abortion. In fact, recent studies show that abortion clinics are closing at a rate of one per month.
- 4) Our Lord sent the apostles forth to teach all nations. By praying the rosary we can become modern day Apostles of Fatima. It is an excellent way to introduce others to the Catholic Faith and to the Fatima message.
- 5) Sin requires reparation: Our culture openly flaunts sin. One can hear it and see it on all forms of public media. Laws favor abortion and same-sex "marriage." The rosary rally will be a public act of reparation for the sins hurled against the Immaculate Heart of Mary and the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Your rosary will console God. Our Lady told the children of Fatima that God wishes to save sinners from hell through devotion to Mary's Immaculate Heart.
- 6) Today's media will never promote the rosary. It's up to us to promote devotion to Mary. Praying the rosary is a powerful way to promote its recitation. Catholics must be proud of their faith. During such rallies, non-Catholics have stopped by requesting a rosary wanting to learn how to pray it.
- 7) The rosary has saved whole countries from being taken over by Communism. When Soviet troops occupied Vienna, Austria at the end of WWII, they refused to leave. Yet after massive rosary processions led by a devout priest, Communist invaders packed up and left. Such large-scale rosary rallies were likewise credited for foiling a Communist takeover of Brazil in 1964. If the rosary saved these countries, it can save America.
- 8) We have a duty to honor God publicly: Secularists have thrown religion and morality out of the public square. Children are not allowed to pray grace before meals. Catholics have a duty to oppose the secularist agenda.
- 9) The rosary rally will prepare for the triumph of the Immaculate Heart of Mary over evil. This historic campaign will hasten God's victory, attract blessings on America and every participant.
- 10) Public prayer is powerful: St. Louis de Montfort states: "Public prayer is far more powerful than private prayer to appease the anger of God and call down His mercy, and Holy Mother Church has always advocated public prayer in times of public tragedy and suffering."
